First Aid Guidelines

The following table outlines the key characteristics of a First Aid claim versus a non-First Aid claim in the State of California, which most likely will result in a recordable claim:

First Aid:

- 1. Returned to work on regular duty no later than the next business day.
- 2. First-degree burns.
- 3. Compresses (hot or cold) by a doctor or nurse on first visit.
- 4. Bandaging (including elastic or Durabond) by a doctor on first visit
- 5. Foreign bodies, not embedded (includes irrigation of eye OR removal from wound by tweezers or other simple techniques)
- Use of non-prescription medications
 OR administration of a single dose of
 prescription medication on the first
 visit (recommended when feasible)
- 7. Antiseptics applied by a doctor or nurse on first visit
- 8. Ointments applied to abrasions
- 9. A negative X-ray
- 10. Observation of injury on second visit
- 11. Tetanus shots, initial or boosters
- 12. Home exercises
- 13. Splints without a metal stay

<u>Non-First Aid:</u>

- 1. Second or third-degree burns
- Whirlpool treatment on any visit or soaking hot or cold, on second or subsequent visit
- 3. Sutures
- Foreign bodies; if removal from wound requires a physician because of depth of embedment, size or shape of object(s) or location of wound
- 5. Prescription medications beyond a single dose used or prescribed
- 6. Antiseptics applied by a doctor or a nurse on second or subsequent visit
- 7. Cutting away dead skin (surgical debridement)
- 8. A positive X-ray
- 9. Treatment for infection
- 10. More than 2 visits
- 11. Returned to work on modified duty
- 12. Need for Physical Therapy,

 Acupuncture or Chiropractic care
- 13. Splints with a metal stay
